

How to fill out your Junior Animal Assessment Score Card

At the final, your Animal Assessment Card will be given to you with your other stockjudging cards and your name will already be printed on.

After you have finished judging the classes you will be shown which animal you will be assessing by the master judge.

Before you come, please read through your Stockjudging guide so you know what to look for but don't worry, the master judge will explain before you start, to help you understand.

Look at the bull and think about how good each part is. For example, for the head and neck – does he have a nice wide muzzle, a strong jaw, are the eyes set nicely apart, does he have nice big ears, and a strong neck.

The Max Score is the most amount of points that you can award the animal for each part that you are looking at. For example, the most points you can give for the head and neck is 10.
